SECTION 4 FIRST AID MEASURES

PRECAUTIONS FOR SAFE HANDLING: Provide appropriate exhaust ventilation at places where dust is formed.

CONDITIONS FOR SAFE STORAGE: Store material in a tightly sealed container away from moisture. Prolonged exposure to the atmosphere may degrade the product.
